

## **EXAM PAPER: Exploring Networked Culture DENC, efterår 2014**

### **THE EXAM PAPER**

- The students can choose a topic of their own choice for the exam paper.
- The projects for the exam papers must be individual.
- The projects must be empirical (it is up to the student to choose from qualitative, quantitative or mixed-methods approaches).
- The exam paper can be written in Danish or English.
- Formally this is known as C: Hand-in exam.

### **TOPIC**

- Choose a topic for your exam paper on your own but within the topic of Networked Culture.
- To make sure that the topic is within Networked Culture use 6-8 references from the first and second part of the specialization (i.e. Digitale kulturer and Exploring Networked Culture). Your exam paper should also include references that you found on your own.
- When you choose your topic, keep in mind that the exam paper must include an empirical part.

### **FORMAT**

- 15-20 pages – normalsider / 36000 - 48000 anslag incl. mellemrum (2400 anslag per side), med 12 pitch og halvanden linieafstand; the list of references is not included.
- The exam paper should include an abstract of about 150 words.
- All sections must be numbered and given a title.
- If you use figures, tables or screenshots, make sure that they show the important points. The figures, tables and screenshots should be numbered sequentially and referenced in the text.
- Use [APA style](#) for in-text references. The open source software [Zotero](#) can help you to manage your references.
- Include a bibliography at the end of your paper, where you list all references used in the paper. There should only be *one* list of references, meaning that references to academic books, journal articles, blogs, newspaper articles, games etc should all go in the same list.
- Remember to use the [standardforsiden](#) when you hand in.
